As you near the end of the Sagtikos Parkway, stay in the left lane and veer onto the Southern State Parkway, traveling east. Continue driving east to Exit 45E. You will see signs for the Arboretum. As you exit onto the ramp, continue driving straight onto Montauk Highway and go thru the light. Arboretum will be on your right.

## **PHOTO COMPETITION – RULES**

**SEPTEMBER 2, 2006**

The exhibitor must have taken the photographs in 2005 or 2006. Prints may be from film or digital media. Exhibitors must enter their photographs at the Photo Entry Table prior to 11:00 am on Saturday morning, September 2, 2006. Photographs may be any size. The photographs may be mounted at the choosing of the exhibitor, but the mounting will not count towards the judging of the photo. Exhibitors may enter as many entries per class; the same picture cannot be entered in more than one class

Judging: All entries on the basis of content, composition, and photographic excellence. Ribbons will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and Honorable Mention in each class. Overall “Best in Show” winner will receive a special award.

Exhibitors must register for the show. They will be given an exhibitor's number when they register; this number must appear on exhibitor's tag on each entry. Use entry tags available at the show.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitors to pick up entries after the show.

## GENERAL RULES \*

- I. Latest classification list of the American Dahlia Society to be used, with exhibits entered accordingly, not classified entries to be entered as they appear.
- II. Show is open to all exhibitors. No entry fee to be charged, exhibitors must sign register book.
- III. Suitable containers supplied for all classes except baskets.
- IV. There will be no restrictions as to the number of blooms entered from one garden in any class.
- V. Entries must be correctly labeled with cultivar name. Incorrectly named entries will be disqualified. Unnamed seedlings must have growers ID number. Past trophy winning seedlings cannot be entered in the future as a seedling.
- VI. Exhibitors name must be concealed, all entries remained sealed until Tri-Color and further awards are chosen, failure to observe this rule will disqualify entry.
- VII. All entries to be grown by exhibitor.
- VIII. No other flowers permitted, all materials used to support stems must be removed before judging, or entry will be disqualified. All entries must have two (2) sets of leaves, excluding Pom Pom's & AOT's, which require a single set of leaves.
- IX. Judging begins promptly at 11:00 A.M.; all entries must be in place at that time.
- X. Only judges, clerks, and committee people are permitted on the floor during judging.

*\*No exhibit shall be removed from the hall without the Show Committee's Consent.*

## GENERAL RULES \*

- XI. First, second and third awards will be made in each class (except seedlings). No award will be made in any class if entry is unworthy. Tri-colors are awarded as noted in the schedule. Judges should check length of the stems especially in close or tri-color decisions.
- XII. The best entries in the seven classes of Other Type dahlias in both 1 and 3 bloom sections will receive Tri-Color ribbons and awards.
- XIII. The decision of the judges will be final. No appeals will be considered except in cases where the entry is in the wrong class. In this case the Show Committee may consider the appeal and act as the see fit.
- XIV. We shall not be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property, but will exercise the utmost care to protect exhibits. Baskets and vases should be labeled with the exhibitors name and address for proper return.
- XV. The Show Committee reserves the right to make additional rules, classes, or to change the schedule as it becomes necessary, or to remove from the tables before or after judging any exhibit it considers in poor condition.
- XVI. All entries except baskets\vases become the property of the Show Committee, to be disposed of at their own discretion at the close of the show.
- XVII. **Judges may not participate in decisions involving their own interests or entries.** In the event a substitute judge is required, that judge must sign the appropriate sheet.

*\*No exhibit shall be removed from the hall without the Show Committee's Consent.*
